Litany of Penitence

Based on Psalm 51 ESV (Page #699 Old Testament NRSV XL Ed)

Leader : Have mercy on me, O God, according to

your loving-kindness; in your great compassion blot out my offenses.

People : Wash me through and through from my

wickedness and cleanse me from my sin.

Leader : For I know my transgressions, and my sin is

ever before me.

People : Against you only have I sinned and done

what is evil in your sight. And so you are justified when you speak and upright in

your judgment.

Leader : Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth,

a sinner from my mother's womb.

People : For behold, you look for truth deep

within me, and will make me understand

wisdom secretly.

Leader : Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure;

wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.

People : Make me hear of joy and gladness, that

the body you have broken may rejoice.

Leader : Hide your face from my sins and blot out

all my iniquities.

People : Create in me a clean heart, O God, and

renew a right spirit within me.

Leader : Cast me not away from your presence and

take not your holy Spirit from me.

People : Give me the joy of your saving help

again and sustain me with your

bountiful Spirit.

Leader : I shall teach your ways to the wicked, and

sinners shall return to you.

People : Deliver me from death, O God, and my

tongue shall sing of your righteousness,

O God of my salvation.

Leader : Open my lips, O Lord, and my mouth shall

proclaim your praise.

People : Had you desired it, I would have offered

sacrifice, but you take no delight in burnt-offerings. The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

Holy and merciful God, we confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. Truly dust we are, and to dust we shall return; and truly yours we are, and to you we shall return. Help this to be a time of turning round and beginning again. Through the forty days of Lent, help us to follow you and to find you: in the discipline of praying and in the drudgery of caring – in whatever we deny ourselves, and

whatever we set ourselves to learn or do.

Help us to discover you in our loneliness and in community, in our emptiness and our fulfillment, in our sadness and our laughter. Help us to find you when we ourselves are lost. Help us to follow you on the journey to Jerusalem to the waving palms of the people's hope, to their rejection, to the cross and empty tomb. Help us to perceive new growth amid the ashes of the old. Help us, carrying your cross, to be signs of your Kingdom. Amen.
