Reaffirmation of Baptism:

Leader: Hear these words from Holy Scripture: Just as the body is one, and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.

(Unison)

People: For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body— Jews or Greeks, slaves or free— and we were all made to drink of one Spirit

Leader: Sisters and brothers in Christ, our baptism is the sign and seal of our cleansing from sin, and of our being grafted into Christ. Through the birth, life, death, and resurrection of Christ, the power of sin was broken and God's kingdom entered our world.

People: Through our baptism we were made citizens of God's kingdom, and freed from the bondage of sin. Let us celebrate that freedom and redemption through the renewal of the promises made at our baptism.

Leader: I ask you, therefore, once again to reject sin, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, and to confess the faith of the church, the faith in which we were baptized.

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

People: I do

Leader: Who is your Lord and Savior?

People: Jesus Christ is my Lord and Savior

Leader: Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his word and showing his love?

People: I will, with Gods help.

Leader: Affirming your faith, what do you believe when you confess your faith in "God the Father Almighty"?

People: That God is a God of love, and that God's love is powerful beyond measure.

Leader: What do you affirm when you confess your faith in Jesus Christ as "our Lord"?

People: That having been raised from the dead he reigns with compassion and justice over all things in heaven and on earth, especially over those who confess him by faith; and that by loving and serving him above all else, we give glory and honor to God.

Leader: What do you believe when you confess your faith in the Holy Spirit?

People: That apart from the Holy Spirit, our Lord can neither be loved, nor known, nor served. The Holy Spirit is the personal bond by which Jesus Christ unites us to himself, the teacher who opens our hearts to Christ, and the comforter who leads us to repentance, empowering us to live in Christ's service.

Leader: What do you affirm when you speak of "the life everlasting"?

People: That communion with Jesus Christ is eternal life itself. In him we were chosen before the foundation of the world. By him the eternal covenant with Israel was taken up, embodied, and fulfilled. To him we are joined by the Holy Spirit through faith, and adopted as children, the sons and daughters of God. Through him we are raised from death to new life. For him we shall live to all eternity. Leader: Hear the good news! In baptism you were buried with Christ. In baptism also you were raised to life with him, through faith in the power of God who raised Christ from the dead. Anyone who is in Christ is a new creation. The old life has gone; a new life has begun. Remember your baptism and be thankful. Since you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
